Q3 2020**

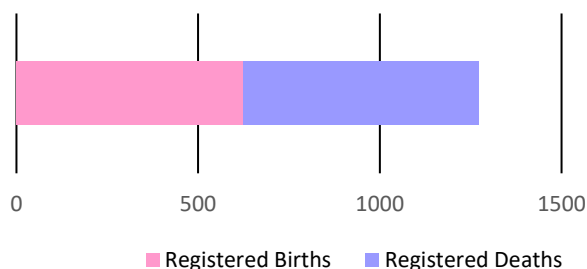

There was a **6.3 percent** expansion in births moving from **587** in 2019 to **624**. The number of births with regards to males fell off by **3.4 percent** and females recorded a noticeable increase of **19.1 percent**.

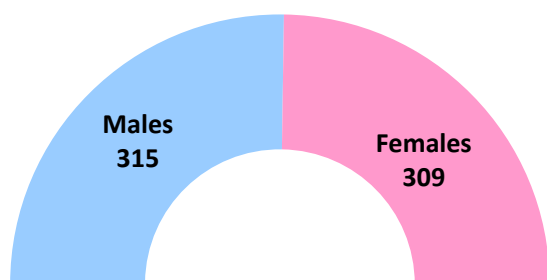
The number of registered deaths showed a decline of **8.7 percent** for the period under review. Both males and females recorded contractions of **6.5 percent** and **10.9 percent**, respectively.

For the third quarter in 2020, there were **309** female registered births, **6** less than that of males (**315**); conversely, in the same quarter of 2019, **320** males were registered when compared to the **267** females.

Registered Deaths by Sex

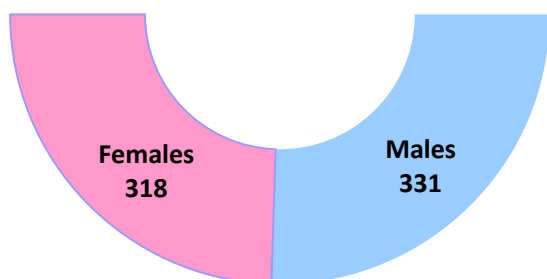

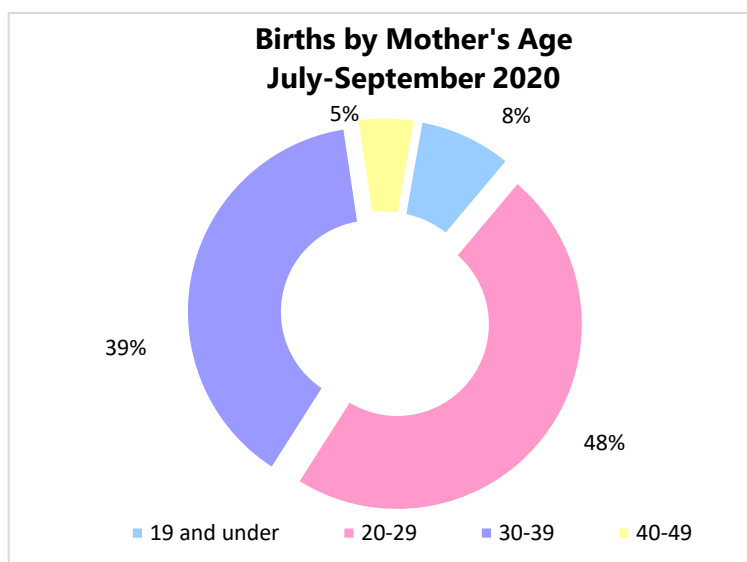
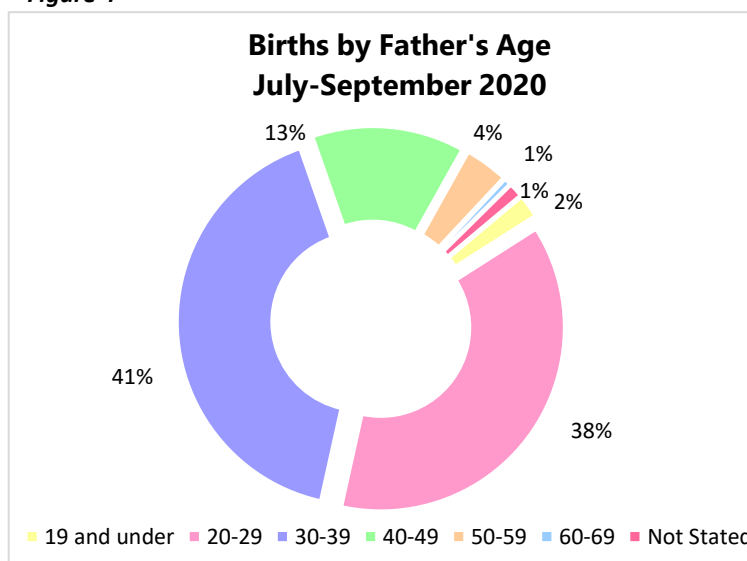

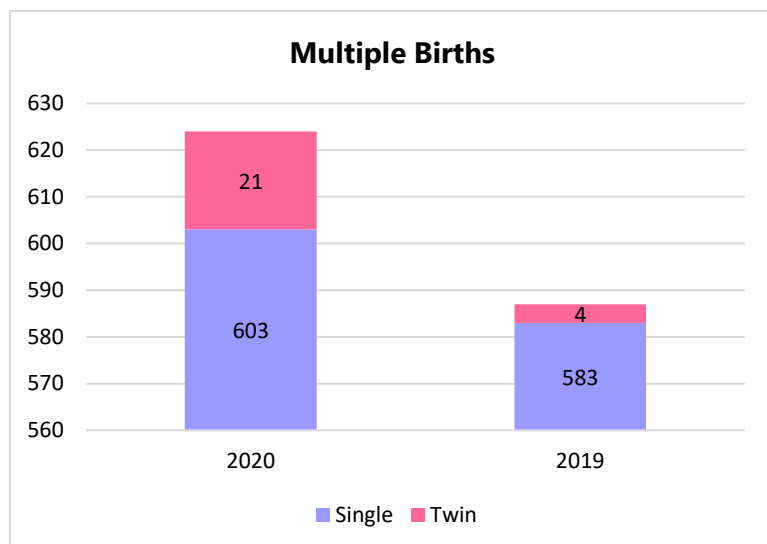
The average age of a mother giving birth was **28.6** years, with **47.9 percent (299)** of the births coming from mothers in the 20-29 age group.

The number of births from mothers in the 40-49 age group increased by **2** from **30** to **32**.

For the period July to September 2020, the youngest mother was **15 years**, followed by **two 16 year olds**, while the oldest mother registered was **47 years**, which stood at **44**, one year before. In 2019, the youngest mother was also **15 years**.

There were five **18 year olds** registered as the youngest fathers, followed by eight **19 year olds**, while the oldest was **63 years** during the third quarter of 2020. For 2019, the oldest father was **63 years old**, while the youngest was **16 years old**.

An expansion was noted in the number of single babies registered in the review period, moving from **583** in 2019 to **603**, representing a **3.4 percent** increase.

The number of twins rose significantly in 2020 to **21** from **4** in the third quarter of 2019.

No triplets were born in the period under review in 2020.

Quarter 3 of 2020 saw increases in births in the majority of the parishes.

The number of babies from St. Michael fell to **196 (10.9 percent)**, although remaining the parish with the highest number of births.

The number of babies for the quarter under review born in St. John and St. Lucy expanded **100 percent** and **85.7 percent**, respectively.

St. Philip babies increased to **75 (10.3 percent)**.

The least number of babies were recorded from St. Andrew – **8**, followed by St. Peter with **16**.

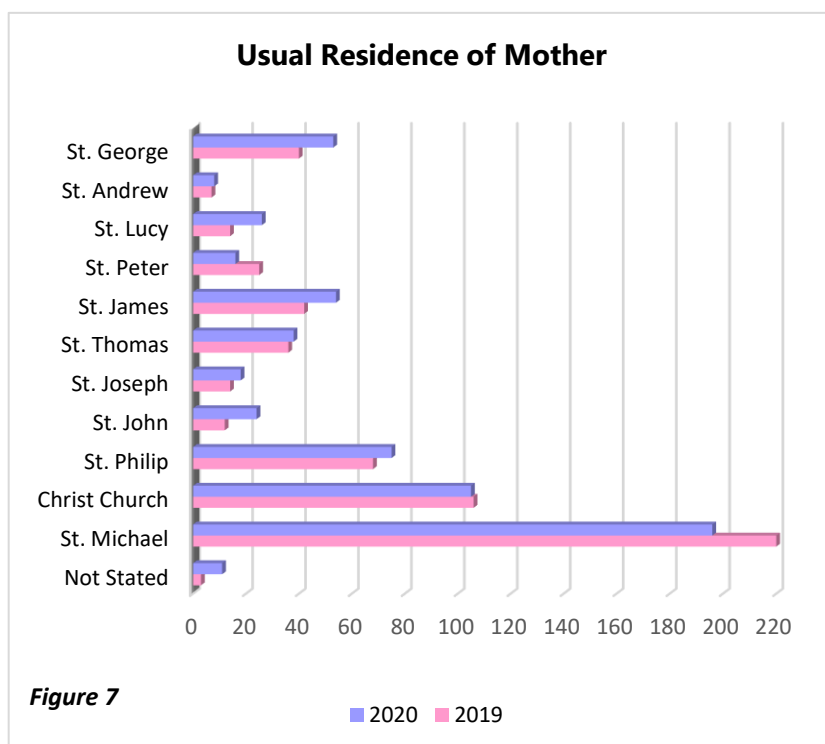

There were **0** still-borns recorded in the third quarter of 2020 when compared to the **4** still births in 2019.

The number of deaths in the period under review dropped by **8.7 percent**.

The average age of death during the period was **71.2** years.

The highest total increase in registered deaths was seen in the **20-29** age group (**7 persons**), while the largest contraction was recorded in the **80-89** age group (**61 persons**).

In July to September 2020, the larger number of deaths was attributed to males – **331**, when compared to **318** females; whereas in the same period for 2019, **354** males passed away, along with **357** females.

With regards to marital status in 2020, the single persons accounted for **41.9 percent** of all deaths, followed by married which stood at **27.4 percent**.

For Q3 of 2020, **St. Michael**, had the largest number of registered deaths – **221** and **250** for 2019. However, the least number of deaths were recorded in 2020 and 2019 was in **St. Joseph** – **16** and the same parish - **10**.

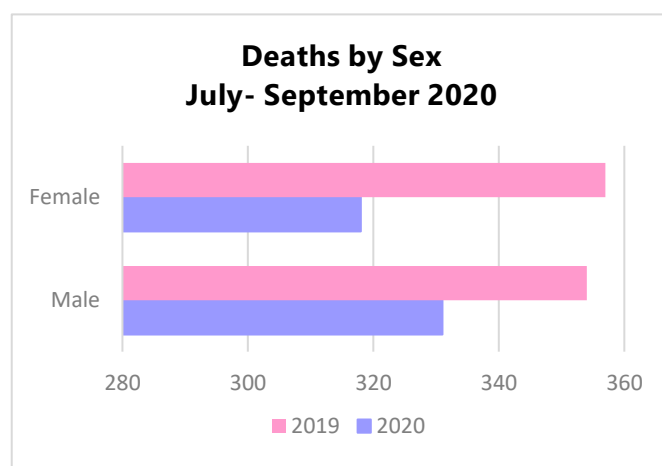
