


## **Births and Deaths Report Q1 2021**



The first quarter of 2021 recorded a reduction of **14.8 percent** in births from **587** in 2020 to **500** in 2021. Both males and females recorded decreases in the number of births, **14.1 percent** and **15.5 percent** respectively.


With reference to the number of registered deaths, a decrease of **1.1 percent** was observed. The number of male deaths recorded a decline.



## **Registered Deaths by Sex**



Registered deaths in the period under review for 2021 were reported as follows: males – **364** and females – **353**. Males declined by **2.4 percent**, and the number of females increased by less than **0.4 percent**, with regards to deaths in the first quarter of 2020.

For the first quarter in 2021, female registered births - **245** while male births were higher at - **255**; conversely, in the same quarter of 2020, **297** males were registered when compared to the **290** females.

The average age of a mother giving birth was **30**, with **51.6 percent** of the births coming from mothers in the 20-29 age group.

The number of births from mothers in the 40-49 age group dropped from **25** in Quarter 1 2020 to **21** in the same Quarter of 2021.

For the period January to March 2021, the youngest mother was **13 years**, followed by **2 16 year olds**, while the oldest mother registered was **48 years**, while it was **47** the year before. However, in 2020, the youngest mother **15 years**.

On the other hand, **one 16 year old**, was logged as the youngest father for the period in 2021; conversely, the oldest was **70 years**; with the average age being **32.7 years**. In comparison for the same period under review in 2020, the oldest father was **65 years old**, while the youngest father was **18 years old**.






There was a decrease in the number of single babies registered in the period under review.

The number of twins increased in 2021 to **20** from **13** in the first quarter of 2020.

No triplets were born in the period during the quarter of note in 2021.

Quarter 1 of 2021 saw decreases in births from the majority of the parishes.

However the number of babies from Christ Church rose to **93** (**1.1 percent**) from **92** in 2020.

Conversely, the number of babies from St. Peter declined to **19** (**5.0 Percent**) from **20 in 2020** 

Babies from St. Thomas remained at 34.

The number of babies for the quarter under review born in St. Joseph fell by **14** or by **77.8 percent**. Accounting for the least number of babies recorded from a parish - **4**.

The parish with the most births was St. Michael and the least number of the same came from St. Andrew.

St. John had the highest increase in births from 2020 (**18.8 percent**).



Both first quarters of 2021 and 2020 recorded **3** still-borns each.



The average age of death during the period was **72.1 years**. Additionally, as the age groups increased, the number of deaths also increased.

Among the age groups the 60-69 category there was no change. The largest percentage increase was the 50-59 range at **12.3 percent** followed by the **70-79** age group **(8.4 percent)**.

In January to March 2021, the larger number of deaths was attributed to males – **364** as opposed to **353** females; whereas in the same period for 2020, **373** males passed away, along with **350** females.

With regards to marital status, single persons accounted for **43.5 percent** of all deaths, followed by married which stood at **27.7 percent**.

**St. Michael**, had the largest number of registered deaths – **248** for Q1 of 2021 and **224** for 2020. However, the least number of deaths were recorded in **St. Andrew** – **11** in 2021, and also in **St. Andrew** for 2020 – **14.**




