


Births and Deaths Report Q1 2023



The first quarter of 2023 recorded an expansion of **14.1 percent** in births (from **555** to **633**), when compared to the same period in 2022.


With regards to the number of registered deaths, there was a decrease of **7.5 percent** moving from **1,004** deaths in Q1 2022 to **929** deaths in the equivalent Q1 of 2023.

Registered Births by Sex Figure 2





For the first quarter in 2023, male registered births – **345** exceeded those of females – **288**; conversely, in the same quarter of 2022, **287** females were registered when compared to the **268** males.

Registered deaths in the period under review for 2023 were reported as follows: males – **476** and females – **453**. Both males and females declined by **5.9 percent** and **9.0 percent**, respectively with regards to deaths in the first quarter of 2022.

The greatest number of births registered with respect to the age of the mother was in the 20-29 age group, **291**, increasing slightly from **255** for the same period in 2022.



Mothers in the 30-39 age group have shown a slight decline in the number of births, from **288** in 2022 to **252** in the review year.

For the period January to March 2023, the youngest mother was **14 years**, followed by **two 15-year-olds**, while the oldest mother was aged **48 years**.

In 2022, the age of the youngest mother was equal to that of the youngest mother in 2023; also, the age of the oldest mother registered in 2022 was three years younger than the equivalent quarter in 2023, which was **45 years**.


On the other hand, there was **one 17-year-old**, who was logged as the youngest father for the period in 2023, while in 2022, the youngest fathers were **three 18-year-olds**; conversely, the oldest was **66 years**, and this reflected the same age group of 60-69 years for the oldest father recorded in the first quarter of 2022, at **61 years**.



Quarter 1 of 2023 saw expansions in the number of births for all parishes except for **St. James, St. Joseph, St. John and St. Peter** which recorded contractions of **10, 5, 2** and **1**, respectively.

The parish with the most births was St. Michael (231) and conversely, St. Joseph registered the least (10).

An increase was noted in the number of single babies registered in the period under review.

The number of twins slightly increased in 2023 to **12** from **8** in the first quarter of 2022.

There were no triplets born for the same period in either year.



There were **0** still-borns recorded in the first quarter of 2023, same as that for the equivalent period in 2022.



Expansions in the number of deaths were noted in the 40-49 age group (11.6 percent) and the 80-89 age group (7.1 percent). The number of deaths for the 10-19 age group remained unchanged. Contractions were noted in the number of deaths for all other groupings with the most significant percentage decrease being observed for the 30-39 age group (58.3 percent), and the 70-79 age group showing the smallest reduction (1.3 percent).

In January to March 2023, the larger number of deaths was attributed to males – **476** as opposed to **453** females; whereas in the same period for 2022, **498** females passed away, **8** less than the number for males.

With regards to marital status, single persons accounted for **43.2 percent** of all deaths, followed by married which stood at **26.0 percent**.

St. Michael for the third year running, had the largest number of registered deaths – **272** for Q1 of 2023 and **370** for 2022. However, the least number of deaths was recorded in **St. Andrew – 20** in 2023, three more for the same parish in 2022 **17.**




