Q3 2000**

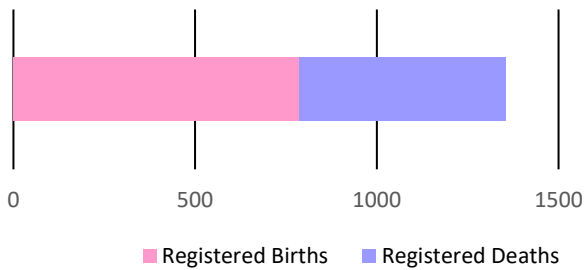

There were **786** births recorded in this quarter. The number of births with regards to males were **24** less than females.

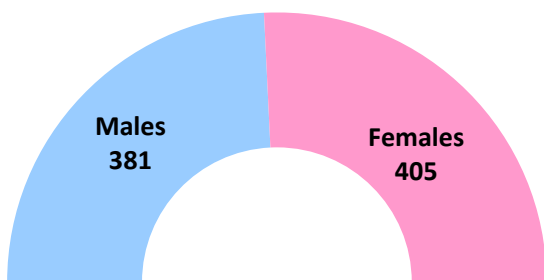
The number of registered deaths were **568** for the period under review, with **263** of them being **male** and **305** were **females**.

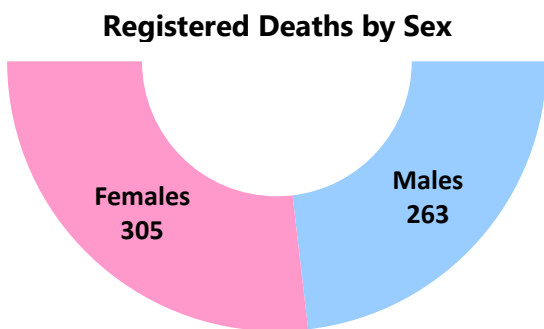

Registered deaths in the period under review for 2000 were reported as follows: males – **263** and females – **305**.

The average age of a mother giving birth was **25.8** years, with **50.4 percent (396)** of the births coming from mothers in the 20-29 age group.

The number of births from mothers in the 40-49 age group was recorded as **29**.

For the period July to September 2000, the youngest mother was **12 years**, followed by **one 14 year old and four 15 year olds**, while the oldest mother registered was **53 years**.

There was one **15 year old** registered as the youngest father, followed by **one 16 year old and two 17 year olds**, while the oldest was **65 years** during the third quarter of 2000.

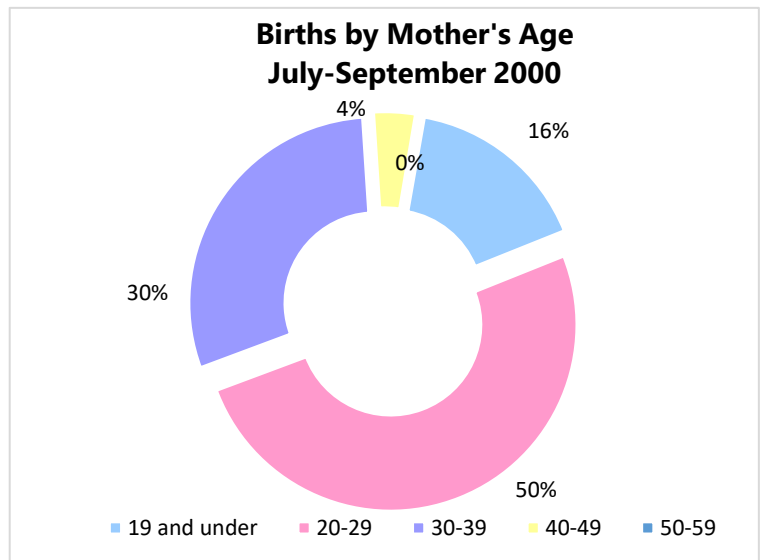

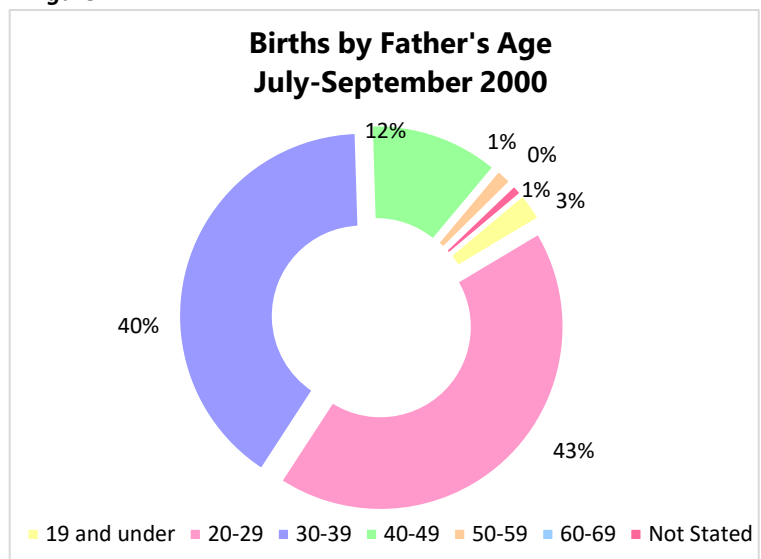
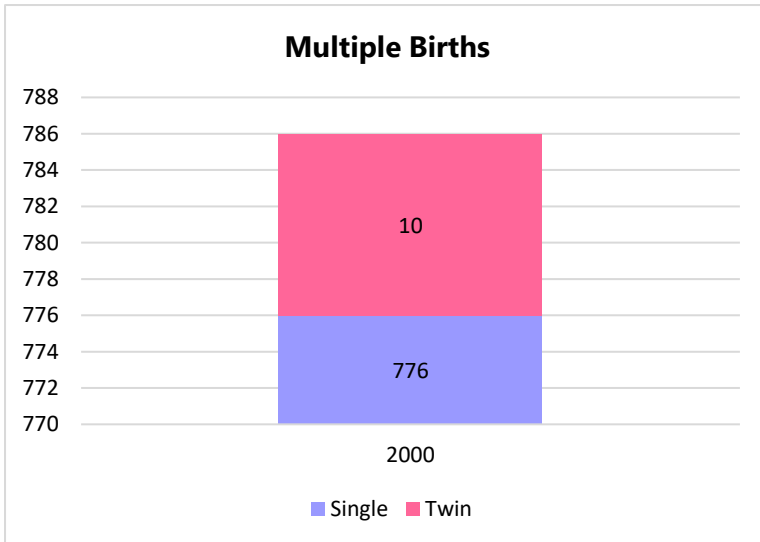

There were **776** single babies and **5** sets of twins registered in the review period.

The multiple births represented **1.3 percent** of total births.

No triplets were born in the period under review in 2000.

The number of babies from **St. Michael** recorded were **300 (38.2 percent)**. This parish recorded the highest number of births.

The number of babies for the quarter under review born in **St. John and St. Lucy** were **37 (4.7 percent)** and **31 (3.9 percent)** respectively.

Christ Church had the second highest number of births (**120**).

The least number of babies were recorded from **St. Joseph – 13**.

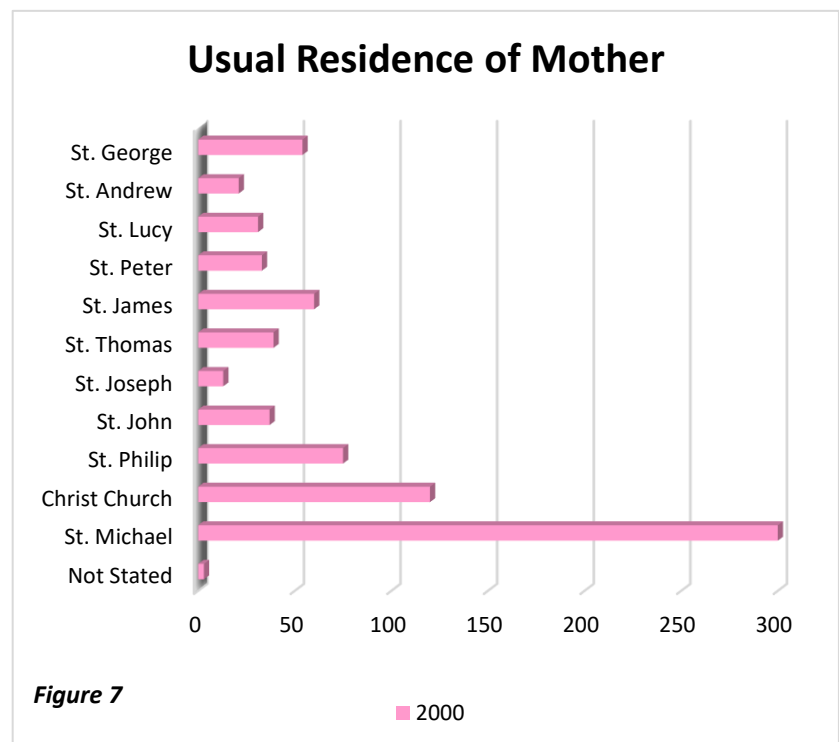

The average age of death during the period was **69.4** years.

The highest age group in registered deaths was seen in the **80-89 (26.8 percent)**, followed by **70-79 (21.7 percent)**.

In July to September 2000, the larger number of deaths was attributed to females – **305**, when compared to **263** males.

With regards to marital status in 2000, the single persons accounted for **31.2 percent** of all deaths, followed by married which stood at **30.8 percent**.

For the third quarter of 2000, **St. Michael**, had the largest number of registered deaths – **185**. However, the least number of deaths recorded in 2000 was in **St. Thomas (16)** and **St. Lucy (16)** followed by **St. Andrew (13)**.

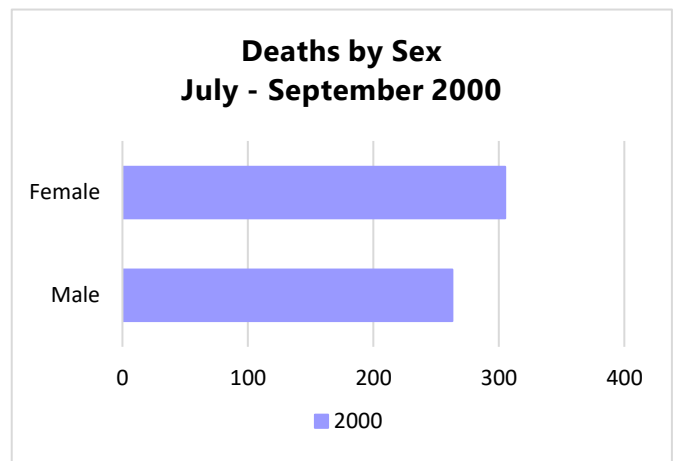

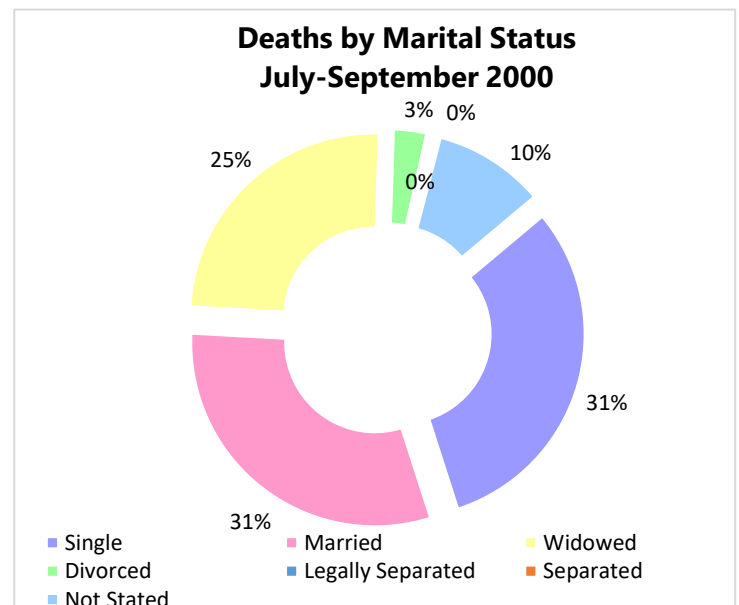
